
- This year the Altoona Police Department responded to **25,566** calls for service.




UCR Summary Six Year Comparison Homicide Offenses




UCR Summary Six Year Comparison Rape Offenses




UCR Summary Six Year Comparison Robbery Offenses




UCR Summary Six Year Comparison Aggravated Assault Offenses











Drug Delivery Resulting in Death Investigation Team

- APD saw a growing need to dedicate Officers with specialized training to investigate DDRD cases.
- In 2022 APD formed the DDRD Team and 12 Officers received this training.
- The Team investigated 26 fatal drug overdoses in 2022.
- 9 arrests for Drug Delivery Resulting in Death were made from 4 of those 2022 investigations.



2022 Community Events

- 25 APD Officers Ran 6.7 miles through the City of Altoona Raising \$1,740 for the PA Special Olympics in the Law Enforcement Torch Run.
- 14 APD Officers jumped in the frigid waters of Canoe Creek for the Polar Plunge, Raising \$5,888 for the PA Special Olympics.
- 52 Officers participate in the 2nd annual "No Shave November" program, donating \$2,600 to the Amelia Sharer Foundation.
- The Fraternal Order of Police participated in the Guns vs. Hoses Charity Hockey game, donating \$4,373 to Family Services.

2022 Community Events Continued

- APD hosted numerous other charity events including: National Night Out, Home Run Derby at the Altoona Curve, Cocoa with the Popo, provided winter hats & gloves to local youth in the APD lobby, and placed 400 flags on Veteran grave sites at Fairview Cemetery on Memorial Day.
- Christmas present donations were collected in the APD front lobby as the department teamed up with Professional's Auto body to provide Christmas morning for over 100 local children in need this holiday season.

Bike Patrol

- Since the disbandment of full time bicycle patrol unit several years ago, the department wanted to find a way to reincorporate the patrol bicycles to engage with the community on a more personal level.
- 5 Officers were sent to the Police Cyclist Course put on by the International Police Mountain Bike Association.
- Manpower permitting, trained bike officers may be assigned to a bicycle during their patrol shift and also assigned to community events.





Community Engagement Details

- Officers assigned to these details visit city parks, pools, housing complexes, and various neighborhoods to personally interact with the community.
- Gets Officers out of their cruisers and gives them the ability to proactively address concerns, many of a non-criminal nature, that sometimes can not be address due to patrol call volume.

2022 Goals

- Evaluate and change APD's organizational structure to make the Department more efficient given current conditions.
 - Many positions within the Department were evaluated, combined, and/or transferred.
- Policy Review.
 - Many Policies were reviewed, however this has become a continual process.

Address Staffing needs.

• 11 Officers were hired in 2022. However the recruiting and retention of Officers remain a challenge in Law Enforcement Nationwide.

2022 Goals Continued

Develop ways to increase proactivity.

- Patrol has increase proactivity (when staffing and call volume allows) as well as many extra proactive details were implemented in 2022.
- Expand our community engagement and participation with local charities.
 - As noted above, APD has help contribute over \$14,000 in monetary donations to charities as well as the collection of food and goods.
 - The recreation of the Bike Patrol along with increased Community Engagement Details.

• Continue to expand the individualized training Officers receive.

An increased effort to expand the types of trainings Officers are sent to. This
not only benefits the Department, but helps Officers increase their
professional growth in areas they have interest in.

2023 Goals and Progress

- Address manpower needs.
- Expand the Patrol rotation program.
- Implement APD K9 Program and evaluate ways to make them the most effective.
- Continue with our high standard of training and assess the training needs of the Department.
- Continue to find new ways to increase community interaction.
