National Impaired Driving Prevention Month

Weekends and holidays can be dangerous times on our roadways. Two of the most celebrated days of the year, Christmas Eve and New Year's Eve, also are among the deadliest. That's why December has been recognized as <u>National Impaired Driving Prevention Month</u>. Taking personal responsibility for a safe ride saves lives. This initiative is in its 44th year and, in light of the tragic loss of two Altoona High School students in one weekend in October as the result of drunk driving, this initiative is close to our community.

National Impaired Driving Prevention Month seeks to educate teens and adults alike about the real dangers of impaired driving. Last year, more than one in eight drivers admitted to driving when they thought they were close to, or over, the legal alcohol limit. Drunk driving was the cause of one-third of all traffic fatalities in the United States in 2023, accounting for about 10,000 lives lost. This is why continued education and awareness are needed.

Alcohol, however, is only one cause of impaired driving. Drugs, including opioids, marijuana and some over-the-counter medications, can impair driving by causing drowsiness, visual malfunctions and delayed mental judgment and motor skills. LOSS Team Initiative

The Suicide Prevention Task Force of Blair County would like to bring a LOSS (Local Outreach to Suicide Survivors) Teams Program to Blair County. These two-person teams, consisting of a survivor of suicide loss and a caring citizen, help families who have lost someone to suicide. Individuals need not have any professional experience or knowledge, just a desire to care and help others in their time of need. All volunteers will be interviewed and will receive training.

LOSS Team volunteers can be a calming reassuring presence. Those who have lost someone to suicide provide a sense of normalcy and hope simply by introducing themselves as someone who has been

impacted by a suicide death. Once trained, a team would be on call for one week, every 4-8 weeks, depending on the number of teams. Currently, the Task Force is assessing local interest and, if there is enough interest, training will begin. Please consider this VERY important initiative for our community.
