June is Alzheimer's and Brain Awareness Month



Alzheimer's & Brain Awareness Month, celebrated each June, is a global initiative led by the Alzheimer's Association to raise awareness about Alzheimer's disease, other dementias and brain disorders. The campaign is focused on warning signs, risk reduction and the importance of early detection. The month's symbol is a purple ribbon.

Over 55 million people worldwide live with Alzheimer's or dementia. In the US, more than seven million people are affected. Brain-healthy habits and early diagnosis can impact the quality of life for those affected by these disorders. The brain changes that cause Alzheimer's can begin as early as 20 years before symptoms start, meaning there may be a substantial window of time for intervention.

For example, studies suggest that Vitamin D supplements can result in a 40% lower incidence of dementia in older adults. Getting exercise and quality sleep can also improve brain health and reduce the risk of cognitive decline. Adopting healthy eating habits and activities that challenge your mind can also protect brain health.

Many people equate Alzheimer's with memory loss and, while that is one of the most common signs, other signs include altered judgment, mood changes, challenges in decision making and planning / carrying out projects. Studies show that many individuals put off discussing these symptoms with a doctor, but the fact is that having an early diagnosis is critically important. There are now treatments that can slow disease progression when begun at the earliest possible stages of the disease.

Women Veterans Recognition Day 2026

June 12, 2026 is Women Veterans Recognition Day in the State of Pennsylvania. This is not a separate day from Veteran's Day, but instead a day to commemorate the signing of the Women's Armed Services Integration Act on June 13, 1948. Women have served the military since the beginning of our Country's history, as nurses, cooks or even disguising themselves as men to fight. The first woman to officially enlist in the military was Loretta Perfectus Walsh, who officially listed in the Navy in 1917.



It is only since 1948, however, that women have been actually recognized as military members or veterans. Since that signing, each state is able to decide whether or not they will celebrate that day. New York was the first to do so in 2008 and, in 2023, the State of Pennsylvania became the 23rd State to recognize and celebrate Women Veterans Recognition Day.

The VA is hosting a Women Veterans Recognition Day event on Thursday, June 12th at the James E. Van Zandt VA Medical Center, at 2907 Pleasant Valley Boulevard. The event, from 11:30 AM – 2:00 PM, will be on the front lawn of the Medical Center near "The Wall That Heals" and will include guest speakers, light refreshments and information on both VA and non-VA programs. All Veterans, families, staff and community partners are invited to attend.

National Flag Week



The week of June 8th is National Flag Week in 2026, with Flag Day falling on June 14th. The day commemorates the adoption of the Stars and Stripes as our United States Flag on June 14, 1777. Interestingly, June 14th also marks the birthday of the United States Army, celebrating its 251st birthday in 2026.

The Gospel Hill Flag has been a landmark in the City of Altoona since 1990, when the first 30 ft x 60 ft American Flag was placed there, and is part of the City of Altoona logo. The flag is replaced 3-4 times each year and is monitored, repaired and replaced as needed by the members of our Altoona Fire Department.

This year, the City of Altoona and the Central Pennsylvania Community Foundation will honor the Gospel Hill Flag at Heritage Plaza on June 14th, beginning at 1:00 PM. The ceremony will include a guest speaker, a Proclamation from Mayor Matt Pacifico, the Altoona Community Band and a hot dog lunch for all in attendance, served by our Altoona Police and Fire Departments. We encourage the public to come out for this meaningful event, and show their support for this important City landmark, our Gospel Hill Stars and Stripes.

BESCP Deb Stitt Memorial Golf Outing

There is still time to register for the Blair Emergency Services Chaplain Platoon's Annual Deb Stitt Memorial Golf Outing, scheduled for July 24, 2026. June is PTSD Awareness Month, and this is a great way to thank our local first responders and to support the men and women who offer much needed assistance and counseling for these workers.

Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) is a mental health condition triggered by experiencing or witnessing events such as war, abuse or disaster. Our first responders see horrific things that can result in flashbacks, nightmares and negative thoughts. The BESCP provides vital counseling and mental health support services, including suicide counseling, for these brave workers, and it is entirely volunteer based. Events like the Deb Stitt Golf Outing provide funds for the work that they do.



The event will be held at King Valley Golf Course, located south of Claysburg in King, exits 10 and 15 on I-99. Advance registration is \$400 per team, or \$100 per golfer, which includes 18 holes, a golf cart and lunch after the round. Same day registration, which is \$125 per golfer, begins at 7:00 AM, with shotgun start at 8:00 AM. You can also participate by sponsoring a team (\$500), a hole (\$100) or a cart (\$50).
